



## **By-Election Day – October 7, 2019**

**Voting to take place October 7, 2019 between 10:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m.**

**Advance Vote to take place September 30, 2019 between 5:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m.**

**Voting station will be located at:**

**Town of Bon Accord, Council Chambers  
5025 – 50 Avenue  
Bon Accord AB**

### **Eligibility to Vote**

A person is eligible to vote in an election held pursuant to the Local Authorities Election Act if the person

- a) is at least 18 years old,
- b) is a Canadian citizen, and
- c) resides in Alberta and the person's place of residence is located in the local jurisdiction on election day.

### **Rules of Residence**

An elector can vote at Council Chambers (5025 – 50 Avenue) for the Town of Bon Accord By-Election on October 7, 2019.

They can only vote once.

A person may be a resident of only one place a time for the purposes of voting.

If a person has more than one residence in Alberta, that person shall, designate one place of residence as the person's place of residence:

The residence of a person is the place where the person lives and sleeps and where they intend to return;

A person does not lose the person's residence by leaving the person's home for a temporary purpose:

A student who

- 1) attend an educational institution within or outside of Alberta,

- 2) temporarily rents accommodation for the purpose of attending an education institution and
- 3) has family members who are residents of Alberta and where the student ordinarily resides when not attending an educational institution is deemed to reside with those family members.

A person shall designate the person's place of residence in accordance with the following factors in the following order of priority:

- a) the address shown on the person's driver's license or motor vehicle operator's license issued by or on behalf of the Government of Alberta or an identification card issued by or on behalf on the Government of Alberta;
- b) the address which the person's income tax correspondence is addressed and delivered;
- c) the address to which the person's mail is addressed and delivered.

### **Proof of Elector Eligibility**

Proof identify and address of the person's residence.

Any of the following documents that has the voter's name and address on it will be accepted as valid proof;

- Photo identification issued by a Canadian government or agency, whether federal, provincial or local;
- Bank/credit card statement or personal cheque;
- Correspondence issued by a school, college or university;
- Income/property tax assessment notice;
- Insurance policy or coverage card;
- Letter from a public curator, public guardian or public trustee;
- Pension Plan statement of benefits, contributions or participation;
- Statement of government benefits: e.g. Employment insurance, old-age security, social assistance, disability support, or child tax benefit;
- Utility bill: e.g Telephone, public utilities commission, television, electricity, gas or water;
- Vehicle ownership, registration or insurance certificate; or
- A letter or form (attestation) confirming that the person lives at the stated address. The letter can be signed by any of the following:
  - authorized representative of a commercial property management company;
  - authorize representative of a correctional institution;
  - authorized representative of a First nations band or reserve;
  - authorized representative of a facility that provides services to the homeless; or
  - authorized representative of a supportive living facility or treatment centre.
